

Christopher R. Cochran, Ph.D.

Christopher R. Cochran, Ph.D. is an Associate Professor, Department of Health Care Administration and Policy, in the College of Community Health Sciences at the University of Nevada Las Vegas. He has authored and co-authored numerous articles on access to care for underserved populations and safety net resources including management issues and quality improvement public and private health care care organizations. His research has also covered the effects of the Nevada Clean Indoor Air Act on the Las Vegas economy and has researched health disparities for Hispanic women in Nevada and access to care for the mentally ill. He has worked on evaluating the cost efficiency in providing services to low income populations and with emphasis on primary care providers and public hospitals. His most recent research focus includes improving bio-surveillance activities in highly mobile transportation areas, tourism and visitor's health care in resort communities, and economic impact of smoking laws in gaming resort communities. Dr. Cochran teaches in the areas of the U.S. health care systems, health care policy, epidemiology, and strategic management. He is past president of the Nevada Public Health Association.
